## **CLINICAL CORNER**

### What is Ehler's Danlos Syndrome (EDS) and how can Hand Therapy help?

The Ehlers-Danlos Syndromes (EDS) are a group of 13 heritable connective tissue disorders. The conditions are caused by genetic changes that affect connective tissue. Each type of EDS has its own set of features with distinct diagnostic criteria and symptoms. Some features are seen across all types of EDS, including joint hypermobility, skin hyperextensibility and tissue fragility.

Hypermobile EDS (hEDS) is the most common type of EDS by far. hEDS accounts for about 90% of EDS cases and is thought to affect at least 1 in 3,100-5,000 people.

People with EDS often experience frequent injuries such as dislocations/subluxations, tendinopathies, and nerve compression injuries, as a result of their joint laxity and hypermobility. They are also more prone to keloid or hypertrophic scarring due to the changes in the genes that affect the structure and function of collagen and related connective tissue proteins.

EDS is a lifelong condition, and there is no cure. At Hand Works, we are specifically aware of the impact joint hypermobility in the upper limb may have on an individual's daily life, and are trained in assessing injuries and poor movement patterns that may be contributing to patient's pain and reduced function. Management techniques are tailored to individual needs, and involve education, functional retraining along with activity modification, custom splinting and bracing to prevent further injury. Patients are also provided with an individualised upper limb strengthening and stabilisation exercise program to allow them to manage their condition long term.
